Subject to Finance committee authorising plan the project will start as soon as possible with a finish date not exceeding two years.	Project manager to be appointed from the aforementioned sub-committee.	Cost at this stage depends on action taken. Funding will come from sponsorship, club assets and fund raising events.

To encourage girls to take up the game of cricket.	Communicate with local schools that the club wishes to support girls cricket and are looking for girls to start a girls only team to compete in the Bradford Junior League.	Beginning of new school term.	Cricket committee.	No cost involved.
